POOL IS OPEN!

Make sure to get your pool memberships!

FROM OUR GOLF MAINTENANCE TEAM

Our Progress this Past Month

We have made a lot of progress these past few months and we are excited to continue to work through our rehabilitation plan.

Turf management this past month has included trying to have the course play more fast and firm. In the meantime you may see be some less greener areas then others as the grass is trained, but this is to enable a faster playing surface on the course.... that means hopefully having your drives roll a little farther, seeing a few less divots and a few less ball marks on the greens.

We have repaired a few electrical issues on the course as well as irrigation leaks in a continual fashion with the older system. We appreciate your willingness to play around us in these situations.

If you have played recently, you will hopefully have noticed the amount of growth in the trouble areas from last year from all the dedicated efforts of Nick and his team. We are continuing to focus on improvement of playability of the golf course from tee to green this month, as well as continue to tackle a number of the restoration areas. You will notice continued work on new sod areas in the fairways, and near high profile walk up zones such as near tees and greens.

Irrigation and Drainage Projects

In coming weeks, we look to fix a drainage issue near #6 green as well as the landing area in #18 fairway. This will include installing a significant amount of drainage pipe and catch basins. When this project starts, these area will be played as ground under repair. We ask that you please be considerate of the team working on these projects during play. The maintenance team will also stay aware of our surroundings and work around the players.

Limited Aeration

To reduce the impact to play during the beautiful weather this month, no large core aeration will be done on the greens this spring/early summer season. We will be continuing to aerify monthly using ninja tines, which have almost no impact to play, to help with turf conditions. The team will also be vertical cutting the greens monthly through the season as well.

GOLF COURSE REHABILITATION

A Reduction in Outlying Rough Areas

As many of you know, Arizona has tight restrictions on water usage especially for golf courses and PGC is no exception. In an effort to efficiently reduce our water usage on non-playable areas around the golf course, we have discontinued watering and maintaining non turfgrass areas. These include areas to the left of #8, in large area between #10/11/12, as well as right of #13, and left of #14. These areas will be moved to more natural vegetation.

This reduction will allow us to focus more time and energy on the playable areas of the course specifically the maintenance of rough height throughout the course and effectively assist the team in providing better course conditions.

Cart Infractions

We still have carts that are not obeying course signage and traffic control measures. These are put in place to help the course and conditions. In recent weeks, we have had fences ran over, sod and rope driven through, and stakes ran over on a continued basis. Please help us keep moving forward with the condition of the course and follow all signage and traffic control that are in place and stay on cart paths at all tee and green complexes.

If a cart is seen driving through roping into newly sodded areas there will be an automatic suspension of 1 week.

Reminder: please stay away from the tees and greens with carts, and to follow all signage on the course. We have implemented multiple rangers on the course daily and our team will monitoring the golf course for the event that any players do not abide by these parameters. We are sure that all play, both members and public alike, will be accommodating to the efforts made to improve the course.

Thank you all in advance for your continued cooperation and patronage at Prescott Golf Club.

GREEN RECOVERY...

We have seen significant improvement to last years damage on the 16th and 18th greens from the fall of 2022. With the weather continuing to improve, we have been able to aerify, seed and fertilize these areas. We expect to continue to see significant improvement in the short while.

PAR 3 CARTS...

Please make sure to keep carts 30yds from Greens

Considering the landing areas and length of a number of our par 3s at PGC, and at the request of many members...

We have moved the cart signs and roping on some of the par 3 holes; such as #3, #12 and #15; so that players are able to drive on the fairways on the par 3s UP TO & NOT BEYOND either the rope and/or the directional cart signs.

Please keep all carts outside of any ropes, and before any directional cart signs.



COACHES' CORNER





One golf shot which strikes fear into the hearts of some otherwise brave people is the bunker shot. Nevertheless it has been said by no less a champion than five time PGA winner Walter Hagen that "The bunker shot is the shot in golf—you don't even have to hit the ball" But the lacks the knowledge and skill for execution of this shot, apprehension prevails. Combine poor technique with a lack of confidence and failure is imminent. However, those who understand the principles of bunker play (including the design of the sand wedge) can, with a modest amount of practice, become quite comfortable in playing the shot.



There are a great variety of bunker styles, yet most employ several of the same principles. On sees, hears or reads about the following preferences: "play down the flight line"-play across the line"-"use an earlier wrist cock"-"use your regular pitch shot"- "set your weight to the left"- "set your weight to

the right'-'hit one inch behind the ball'-'hit six inches behind the ball'-'play the ball off your left heel"-

Bunker Shot, not trap shot! The word trap is not in the rule book ...

"play the ball in the middle" = "use a steeper V-shaped swing"-"use the same length backswing for all sand shots"-"use a normal U-shaped swing"-"vary the length of the backswing to the length of the shot"-"start with the face square and block the finish"-"start with the face open and use a normal release"- The list could go on. What is the best style? The technique recommended here is the easiest, safest, and most dependable for the greatest players...



The techniques which appear to be accepted by a majority of golf's most successful players are these:

- Establish a firm footing that will support the swing without slipping, yet will not dg the feet to deeply. Longer shots require a better base.
- Take an open stance to restrict backswing length and to steepen the swing.
- Open the clubface to match the address position...
- Start with the weight favoring the left side at address position.
- Ball position is forward
- * Swing the club like a full "cut pitch shot," matching the length of the backswing and follow-through to the force needed for that shot.
- Strike the sand from 2-4 inches behind the ball, to enable the sand to carry the ball out and onto the green.
- Do not let the face close until after impact if at all.
- Continue to accelerate through the ball to a natural finish.

Greenside Bunker Play

Fairway Bunker Shots

When the ball s in the fairway bunker and the objective is to get greater distance, a fundamental principle changes. Whereas in the normal "greenside bunker" shot, a player should always contact the sand first, in a fairway bunker they should always contact the ball first. Most of the adjustments are related to this one objective...Once you have selected a club with adequate loft to safely clear the lip of the fairway bunker you should then make the following adjustments:


- * First, check the lie. A good lie will allow a normal swing with few adjustments. A medium lie may require more descent, a poor lie may require a "pitch out" to the fairway.
- Establish sold footing
- * Grip down on the club the same amount the feet have been worked into the sand.
- * Position the ball more toward the center of the stance.
- Place hands slightly ahead of the ball as with normal shot, not sitting too much in the knees, even playing slightly "stiff-legged"
- * Sweep the ball from the sand as though it were resting on a sheet of glass.
- Look not at a spot behind the ball as some do in a greenside bunker, but look rather at the front edge of the ball, or just slightly ahead of it, to help assure <u>ball contact is</u> made before sand contact

FOR THE TROUBLE SHOTS

- * The Philosophy here is "Don't follow a bad shot with a bad decision." In other words, first put the ball back into play, gambling only when you are reasonably sure of success and the gamble will save at least half a shot. If you are satisfied that the shot you are about to attempt can net you a score of four and not worse than a five, go for it. If a miss will cost you a six or worse, get the ball into play and proceed from there.
- * Greenside your next shot is a putt!
